FEDERAL LEGISLATION

1. The Senate approved the **ban on partial-birth abortions** by a bipartisan 64-33 majority. The House Judiciary Committee (3/27/03) then passed the ban by a party-line 19-11 vote. The Act (**H.R.760**) has been introduced in the House. The House version does not include an amendment inserted in the Senate bill reaffirming the Roe v. Wade decision legalizing abortion and urging that it not be overturned. However, the vote may not take place until just before the August recess. President Bush has said he will sign the measure. **ACTION:** Please contact your Congressman regarding the ban on partial-birth abortions.

On April 2, 2003, Congressman Ron Paul, M.D. introduced the **Partial-birth Abortion Funding Ban Act of 2003 (H.R. 1545)**. This bill prohibits federal officials from paying any federal funds to any individual or entity that performs partial-birth abortions.

2. The **Unborn Victims of Violence Act (S 146)**, recently introduced by Sen. Mike DeWine (R., Ohio) and Rep. Melissa Hart (R., Pa.) in their respective houses, will ensure that criminals are held accountable for injuring a pregnant woman AND her unborn baby. **ACTION:** Encourage your Members of Congress to bring this critical pro-life legislation up for a vote. The Unborn Victims of Violence Act has been introduced before [See- MEDIA REACTS p. 6], and reflects similar bills in at least 26 states nationwide. The federal bill would recognize all unborn children injured or murdered during the commission of federal crimes as legal victims.

3. QUOTE WORTHY -- Discovery Institute fellow Wesley J. Smith, in a column published April 18, 2003, by Pro-life Infonet: "Senators Orrin Hatch (R-UT) and Dianne Feinstein (D-CA) are two of the great legislative con artists of our time. Their bill -- S-3, the 'Human Cloning Ban & Stem Cell Research Protection Act' -- purports to outlaw human reproductive cloning while explicitly authorizing 'SCNT' (somatic cell nuclear transfer) for the purpose of finding medical treatments using embryonic stem cells. Never mind that SCNT is simply the term for the most common method of cloning mammalian life. And never mind that the same technique is used whether the cloned embryo is to be exploited and destroyed in medical research or implanted, gestated and brought to birth. The true purpose of the legislation is to cynically give weak-kneed legislators a 'two-fer' -- that is, allowing them to tell their constituents that they voted against human cloning while actually they are voting for it." The **Brownback/Landrieu Human Cloning Prohibition Act of 2003, S. 245** is the only bill among several competing versions that bans all forms of human cloning. The Senate will be considering this soon. President Bush has called on Congress to pass the complete cloning bill. ACTION: Please contact your senators to emphasize the need for such a bill that respects human life and dignity. [See related article: NIH Proceeding with Embryonic Stem Cell Research p. 7]

4. In a move by Rep. Joe Crowley (D-NY), Democrats successfully added an amendment to the State Department bill that would nullify President Bush's decision earlier this year to defund the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA). For 18 years, the **Kemp-Kasten Amendment** has prevented funds from going toward organizations that support or actively participate in coercive abortions and sterilizations. Rep. Crowley's amendment basically renders the Kemp-Kasten language null and void. This bill could reach the House floor next week. Please call your congressman today and tell him to remove the Crowley amendment from the **State Department bill**.

5. A bi-partisan proposal to send **\$15 billion** to organizations and agencies overseas for "prevention and treatment" of AIDS in Africa and the Caribbean is being considered in Congress. The bill is called the **U.S. Leadership Against HIV/AIDS, TB, and Malaria Act of 2003 (H.R. 1298)**. It calls for \$3 billion over five years and is a response to President Bush's remarks in his State of the Union address, in which he called the AIDS crisis in Africa and the Caribbean an "emergency" and asked for \$15 billion to address the problem. (*OneWorldUS*, Jim Lobe, 3/18/03) On Thursday, May 1, the U.S. House passed H.R. 1298 with the amendments the House Committee on International Relations had failed to adopt. One third of the money will now go to fund abstinence education programs. A conscience clause to protect faith-based agencies from being forced to dispense condoms was attached to the bill. The House also attached an amendment making the U.N. Global AIDS Fund more accountable. A similar measure will soon be considered by the U.S. Senate. Senator Bill Frist will take up H.R. 1298 & offer it as a Senate version. Senators Daschle, Lugar, and Kerry, however, are going to offer a "strike and replace" amendment that will allow them to avoid specific amendments—and give them the power to gut any of the positive amendments within H.R. 1298. On May 9, the Traditional Values Coalition reported that groups receiving Global AIDS Fund money included: Planned Parenthood, San Francisco AIDS Foundation, Guttmacher Institute, and Advocates for Youth. "All of these groups are advocates of abortion as well as homosexuality." ACTION: Contact your Senators about this bill and its amendments and the organizations receiving fund money.

6. Call about or Watch for information on the following "life-related" bills introduced in this Congress: "The Right to Life Act of 2003 (HR579)", "The School Children Health Protection Act", "Freedom of Conscience Act of 2003" (H.R. 1548), "Judicial Limitation Act of 2003" (H.R. 1546), "Adoption Information Act" – H.R. 1229, Equal Rights Amendment (ERA), The "RU-486 Patient Health & Safety Protection Act" (HR-486), "Informed Choice Act" (HR 195) (S 340), "Child Custody Protection Act" (S. 851), (H.R. 1755).



IOWA LEGISLATION:

1. **SF 3 Statistical Reporting Chemical Abortion RU-486** was signed into law by Governor Vilsack April 21, 2003. The bill that requires the reporting of abortions done by chemicals such as mifepristone (RU-486) to the state health department. There will not be any statistics kept to record any kind of complication. The only statistics will be how many pills were distributed. [One of the best kept secrets of the abortion industry is the number of women harmed from abortion. No records are kept of complications regarding any type of abortion in Iowa. Iowa Right to Life intends to introduce a bill that will add complications to the abortion statistics.]

2. *“Choose Life” license plate (emblem) will provide funding for pregnancy centers and adoption agencies in Iowa. The plate will go on a standard Iowa plate with a picture of two children on the left side of the plate and the words “choose life” on top. It will cost \$35. We must have 500 people pre-registered to buy the plate. Without the minimum of 500 names, the DOT is unable to approve production of the new plate. Furthermore, we need a state department to sponsor the bill to be able to direct the funds to pregnancy centers.* IA code 321.34 (d) specifies that a state agency may request special registration plates. Iowa Right To Life (IRLC) requested that the Department of Health to act as the sponsoring state department for the “Choose Life” emblem on the Iowa license plate. In reviewing the WIC and the Family Planning program, it is clear that the Department functions to *help* people including pregnant and postpartum women. The Department of Health has indicated that they do not want to sponsor the plates. IRLC have requested their response in writing, which we will give you as soon as it is received. 3. **Mandatory Reporting Passed the House and Senate. Final action left: H.F. 206 must be signed by the Governor.** House File 206 increases the age for mandatory reporting of suspected sexual abuse of a child by a non-caretaker from under age 12 to under age 16. Reporting is mandated if the reporter has knowledge of any sexual activity. This bill was proposed because of clear evidence that as a policy, Planned Parenthood fails to report every potential sexual abuse of young girls, which protects sexual predators from being investigated. Raising the age limit from 11 to 15 years old will close a loophole they currently take advantage of. If it becomes law, it will force Planned Parenthood to report any pregnant girl under 16 who comes through their doors. Mandatory reporters are professionals who have frequent contact with children, generally in one of six disciplines: health, mental health, education, law enforcement, child care and social work. When the Iowa House debated House File 206, they added clergy to the current list of mandatory reporters. The addition of the clergy amendment to the bill was not IRLC’s intent. There is far more sexual abuse as a result of Planned Parenthood’s protection of sexual predators than the abuse found in the church.

Planned Parenthood is asking their supporters to seek Governor Vilsack’s veto, stating that it will deter kids from seeking help from trusted adults, overwhelm an overburdened, under funded system and divert valuable resources from sexual abuse cases that need immediate attention. **ACTION:** Contact Governor Vilsack and let him know what you expect him to do!! JUDICIAL NOMINATIONS

The Senate gridlock on confirmations has sparked a constitutional crisis and is deepening the judicial emergency of vacancies on the federal bench. In an attempt to end the filibuster of President Bush's judicial nominees, Senate Majority Leader Bill Frist introduced a resolution modeled after a proposal introduced in March by Georgia Democrat Zell Miller. Miller's plan was based on a resolution originally introduced in 1995 by Democrats Tom Harkin of Iowa and Joseph Lieberman of Connecticut. The difference is that Frist's plan only applies to executive appointments, whereas the Harkin/Lieberman proposal was sweeping and would have also applied to regular legislation. The plan would do away with the current system in which 60 votes are always required to stop a filibuster blocking a vote on a nominee. Instead, the 60 votes would be required on only the first effort to break the filibuster. After that, each successive vote would have a lower requirement: first 57 votes, then 54, and then 51. "As majority leader, I don't want to tell people how to vote, but I do want to respect that basic tenet of the Constitution of 'advice and consent' that gives every United States senator that right, that ability to give advice and consent," Frist said. "As long as you have Democrats filibustering in this unprecedented way," he continued, "our senators are being denied that opportunity to give that advice and consent. Why? Because they're being denied that opportunity to vote." Dr. Frist was joined in his denunciation of the situation by President Bush, "We are facing a crisis in the Senate and therefore a crisis in our judiciary. Highly qualified judicial nominees are waiting years to get an up-or-down vote in the United States Senate." Mr. Bush added that the judicial confirmation process was "broken and must be fixed for the good of our country." Although nine currently serving Senate Democrats supported the Harkin/Lieberman change, the NY Times reports that Frist's proposal 'seems to have no chance of winning enough Democratic support to be put into effect.' **ACTION:** Contact your Senators about this!!

MEDIA REACTS: In response to the arrest of Scott Peterson on double murder charges after the bodies of his wife Laci and their eight month unborn son Connor, Mavra Stark, president of the Morris New Jersey chapter of the National Organization for [sic] Women (NOW), stated she “couldn’t see charging [Mr. Peterson] with a double murder . . . if [Connor] wasn’t born.” Media reaction to Stark’s comments about Scott Peterson’s double murder charge swiftly became the day’s hottest topic. This position is nothing new. The abortion lobby -- NARAL, Planned Parenthood, NOW -- has vehemently opposed the Unborn Victims of Violence Act, which would put into federal law the principle which already exists in many states, that in non-abortion situations, charges can be brought separately for violent crimes against unborn babies and against their mothers. Politicians, too, have twice turned their backs on justice for little ones like Connor Peterson. The US House of Representatives have twice voted against the Unborn Victims of Violence Act. The Senate Judiciary Committee refused to advance the proposal to the Senate in either Congress. Eighty-four percent of registered voters agree that a double homicide charge is appropriate in incidents similar to the Peterson case. This legislation not only acknowledges but also defends the personhood of the unborn.

PRO-CHOICE = NO-CHOICE

Pharmacists for Life International (PFLI) are the original proponents (since 1987) of a no-compromise universal pharmacist’s Conscience Clause. Several states have been working on such a bill. Bo Kuhar, PharmD., Executive Director and Founder of PFLI recently reported that the Wisconsin Assembly Labor Committee passed legislation patterned after a South Dakota law - the first of its kind in the nation - that shields pharmacists from being sued or fired if they refuse to dispense drugs used for abortion, suicide or euthanasia. Missouri and North Carolina are also currently considering such legislation that would recognize the rights of pharmacists not to engage in procedures that violate their consciences. In Nevada, state senators have tabled a Planned Parenthood-backed bill that would have told pharmacists they could not refuse on moral grounds to dispense certain drugs. The bill targeted Catholic and Mormon pharmacists who cited religious reasons for refusing to fill prescriptions for birth control and morning-after pills. (Reading: "Senate tables bill to force pharmacists to fill prescriptions," Las Vegas Review Journal, 5/6/03, http://www.lvrj.com/lvrj_home/2003/May-06-Tue-2003/news/21258397.html; AB144, Nevada legislature, 2/14/03, <http://www.leg.state.nv.us/72nd/Reports/history.cfm?ID=316>) The Wisconsin bill's author, Rep. Carol Owens (R-Oshkosh) stated, "With the increase in the availability of prescription drugs that can induce abortion and end the lives of those who are elderly or terminally ill, pharmacists have been put into a position where they must choose between their job or their conscience." Opponents, including Planned Parenthood, argued that the bill would allow pharmacists to refuse to fill birth control prescriptions if they are morally opposed to women taking such medications. "The bill will not make drugs such as the morning-after pill and the birth control pill unavailable. It simply recognizes that pharmacists, like doctors and nurses, are valued members of the professional health care team who should not be forced to choose between their consciences and their livelihoods. Just as a woman's legal right to surgical abortion should not compel a hospital to provide one, a woman's legal right to abortifacient drugs should not compel a pharmacist to dispense them." "People who call themselves 'pro-choice' should especially appreciate the intent of this bill," said Peggy Hamill, Pro-Life Wisconsin's state director. "Pharmacists should have the right to choose not to be complicit in the taking of innocent human life."

PRO-CHOICE=POOR CHOICE

David Reardon, Director of the Elliot Institute, has suggested that pro-life activists start to use the term “poor choice” in response to our opponents use of pro-choice to describe their position. His response to the question, “Why?” as reported by ZENIT News Agency:

First, this term accurately describes abortion. Abortion is a poor choice. Framing it in that sense reminds listeners of that fact. As noted earlier, the vast majority of people already see abortion as a choice that is riddled with emotional land mines and produces little, if any, benefit to women.

Second, abortion advocates learned long ago that if the discourse was allowed to center on abortion itself, they would lose ground. Their market research led them to realize that their appeals for support were stronger when they focused on the abstract idea of “choice” rather than the reality of abortion.

Third, “poor choice” has an especially strong rhetorical value because it sounds so much like the phrase “pro-choice”. It is memorable. It creates a mental link between “pro-choice” and “poor choice” that quickly erodes the value of all the “pro-choice” cliches. Who wants to be in favor of a bad choice?

Morning After Abortion Pill Under Review By FDA - The FDA is accepting and reviewing public comments on a proposal to make the "Morning After Abortion Pill" available as an over the counter drug -- that is, without even seeing a doctor. **Take action now** by writing a letter of opposition to Dockets Management Branch, Food & Drug Administration, Department of Health & Human Services, Room 10-61, 5630 Fishers Lane, Rockville, MD 20857, RE: Docket 01P-0075 ("Switch Status of Emergency Contraceptives from Rx to OTC"). Dear Commissioner:

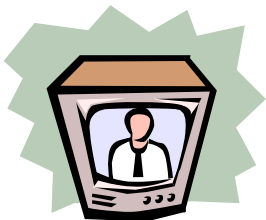
Regarding Docket 01P-0075: This drug regimen was approved for prescription use without the testing that would normally be required. As a result, women considering the use of this regimen may be misled about the safety, effectiveness and mode of action of this regimen. In particular, the drug's interference with implantation which could be of moral concern to women taking it, is not disclosed in many cases. I strongly oppose the reclassification of "Emergency Contraceptives" as an over the counter drug.
