FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESK

ENDING ABORTION "The way to ultimately stop abortion is by changing the hearts of the women who make the decision to kill their baby." (Bill Keller) The best way to change hearts is to spread the truth. David Reardon, often says that the way to get rid of abortion is for women who have had abortions to tell their stories. In our speaker training sessions, we always tell our candidates to tell their story. One can back their story up with facts and figures, but the big thing that will capture an audience is the story. Anyone can argue statistics and the results of studies but no one can dispute a personal testimony. Thus, in spite of the senate filibuster of all pro-life judges and in spite of the inaction on or defeat of pro-life legislation, abortion will end in this country. What makes me so sure? OPERATION OUTCRY:SILENT NO MORE (SNM). I quote Georgette Forney, Co-Founder of SNM: "This mobilization of women will be the beginning of a national campaign to raise awareness about the negative after-effects of abortion and speak the truth about abortion's emotional, spiritual and physical consequences for women. The campaign will also seek to reach the many women who are suffering in silence, offering them abortion recovery, help and resources. . . . After 30 years it's time to listen to the women who have experienced it. . . . While the campaign is encouraging women to speak publicly, we recognize not everyone is comfortable doing so."

Some members of DCRTL attended a press conference in Bettendorf on June 20th and met members of the SNM group. Their compelling testimonies included the following statements: "What nobody tells you is that the guilt and depression will soon set in and the life as you knew it would forever be changed." "My arms are empty forever all because I believed the lie that abortion could solve my problem." "Do you know how hard it was to tell my husband that because of the 'choices' I made, he would never have his own biological children?" "Our stories are the cry of our hearts. We have been hurt!!!"

Our hearts went out to these women as they shared their stories. Women deserve better than abortion! We have invited these women to Dubuque. We want them to share their stories with others, many of whom are suffering in silence. It will be good for us. We want to share our Memorial to the Unborn with them. It will be good for them. 1. Because the House and Senate versions of the **partial-birth abortion (PBA) ban** are different, a "conference" committee must be formed to make them conform to one bill the President can sign. Ken Connor, President of The Family Research Council, reports that Senate Republicans have agreed to drop language affirming Roe v. Wade from their version clearing the way for the two bills to be reconciled and sent to President Bush for his signature. The pro-abortion crowd will seek to kill this law the moment President Bush signs it. Congressman Steve Chabot (R-OH), who sponsored this bill, feels confident it can withstand the court challenges which are sure to come.

2. The **Unborn Victims of Violence Act** or "**Laci & Conner's Law**" would clarify that, in the context of federal jurisdictions such as military facilities, unborn children injured or killed in attacks on their mothers are victims in their own right. A congressional subcommittee hearing in the House on 7/9/03 makes way for the bill (HR-1997) to come to a full vote on the House floor. The Senate may also consider the bill (S-1019) this month (July).

3. On February 27th, the United States House of Representatives passed the **Human Cloning Prohibition Act of 2003** (HR 534) with bi-partisan support. The Bill is STILL awaiting a Senate vote!

4. House Will Vote on UNFPA Funding -The House of Representatives is expected to take a crucial vote on whether or not to extend taxpayer funding to the United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA). UNFPA has long history of support for population control programs and support for or indifference to forced abortion and/or sterilization in China, North Korea, Mexico, and Peru. Representatives Christopher Smith (R-NJ), James Oberstar (D-MN) and Henry Hyde (R-IL) are offering an amendment to the **State Department Authorization bill (HR-1950)** which would both strip out the massive increase in funding and restore the 18-year-old Life-protective Kemp/Kasten law. Congress had appropriated \$34 million for UNFPA last year, President George W. Bush embargoed the funding after concluding that the agency is continuing to abet Red China's horrific "one-child" depopulation scheme, making UNFPA ineligible for US funding under Kemp/Kasten. Rep. Joseph Crowley's (D-NY) amendment, adopted by a one-vote margin in the House Committee on International Relations early in May, hikes the funding to \$50 million. The measure will likely be debated in the House after the July 4th recess. Let your Representative know which amendment you want passed!

Senate Passes Motion Overturning Mexico City Policy-On July 9, the Senate approved a motion sponsored by Sen. Barbara Boxer (D-CA) to overturn President Bush's policy against taxpayer funding of organizations that "perform or actively promote abortion as a method of family planning in other nations." Senator Dick Lugar (R-IN) asked the Senate to table the Boxer amendment. However, the Senate defeated Lugar's motion 53-43, thus accepting the amendment.

5. Rep. Todd Akin of Missouri introduced the **Parent's Right to Know Act of 2003, H.R. 2444**. The bill requires that written notice be provided to parents before contraceptive drugs or devices are dispensed to their minor children. Currently, federally funded clinics are barred from notifying parents when their children seek birth control.

6. The **Freedom of Conscience Act of 2003 (H.R. 1548)** which prohibits any federal official from expending any federal funds for any population control or population planning program or any family planning activity, was introduced on April 2 by Rep. Ron Paul (R-TX)

7. The National Family Planning & Reproductive Health Assn. (NFPRHA), is launching a campaign to "save **Title X**," the federal program which funds Planned Parenthood (more than \$50 million annually) and received a \$10 million increase in the Fiscal Year 2003 (FY03) omnibus appropriation. President Bush is proposing to return Title X to its FY02 level, and a growing number of Congressional Members are seeking to reform the program's rules. "Saving Title X" actually means demanding a further hike in funding, from \$275 million to \$325 million for FY04. (Since its inception, Title X has received approximately \$5 billion and has fostered premarital and extramarital sexual activity, abortions and family divisions. Title X grantee agencies are barred by federal regulation from notifying parents of minors seeking sex-related services and typically fail or refuse to notify child protection authorities of suspicions of statutory rape.) Title X promotes contraception, including the abortifacients.

Both the Parent's Right to Know Act and the Freedom of Conscience Act deal with Title X population control money. The Parent's Right to Know Act requires parental consent but allows for judicial bypass. If passed, it would have some effect on Planned Parenthood (PP) because PP receives Title X funds. It will have no effect on non-Title X recipients. The Freedom of Conscience Act would get rid of all federal funding for any population control or population planning program or any family planning activity (including any abortion procedure). Thus, while the Parent's Right to Know Act is good, the Freedom of Conscience Act is better. As far as Title X goes, the best approach is to eliminate the program completely.



Governments have spent billions of dollars to search out life on other planets. Doesn't it make you wonder what would happen if new life on another planet were to be discovered? Would it, too, be killed for convenience because it was deemed unwanted, as are millions of unborn babies in this country?

IOWA LEGISLATION

1. Choose Life License Plates - This legislation died before reaching a vote. The alternate plan was to get a plate with a choose life emblem. However, state departments are refusing to sponsor the plate even though enough signatures were obtained. There are now two options: go back to the legislature and try to pass another bill OR change the law that requires a state department to sponsor the emblem to only require a certain number of people pre-signed up. Kim Gordon (Iowa Right To Life Committee) says the problem is that the legislators do not feel it is important, "We need the grass roots to put the pressure on."

2. HF 206, the Mandatory Reporting Bill, was vetoed by Governor Vilsack who asserts that changing the law would make children into criminals. Not so. A report does not make a criminal, but rather, the report is a response to a criminal action. If a man or a boy has sexual relations with a 12 or 13 year old, it is statutory rape according to Iowa law. Reporting only exposes the crime. To not report it simply means the crime occurred but the perpetrator will NOT be *caught*, thus allowing continued abuse. Governor Vilsack has much to answer for.

NARAL Plans Extensive 2004 Election Effort

Washington, DC -- Seeking to increase its elections efforts in the 2004 election cycle and to stay a key player in the Democratic party's presidential nomination process, NARAL Pro-Choice America has hired veteran Democratic operative Michael Meehan to oversee its vastly expanded soft-money fundraising operation. Kate Michelman, the president of NARAL Pro-Choice America, said Meehan's hiring is "demonstrative of how important our political work is and how important the 2004 elections are." "These moves signal that NARAL Pro-Choice America is in it to win it and wants to position itself as a major political player in the 2004 election," added Jenny Backus, a consultant to the organization.

WAKE UP, PRO-LIFE AMERICA - The abortion industry has, as the saying goes, "all its ducks in a row." This means that **we must** do the same. Now is the time to get involved in the political scene. It's time to learn about your political party's platform, to get familiar with how your elected officials stand on various issues, to decide how much you can help to get pro-life individuals elected. It's time to make plans to attend local meetings. You may, but do not have to speak. Either way, your vote counts. It's time to become familiar with the whole process. Pay attention to what goes on and how things work. It's time to be involved; to be there - for the babies, the elderly, the infirm - for all whose lives are threatened by those who exploit their particular life situations for profit.

TRAGIC IRONY - SPEAKING OF "DUCKS IN A ROW" -did you hear this? In her July 1, 2003 article, titled: "Lame Ducks -- Some Are More Worthy Than Others" Kathryn Jean Lopez, *National Review Online* Editor, discussed a *Washington Post* article she had seen. She related that rush-hour traffic had been stopped in Washington, D.C. because a mother duck and her four ducklings were in the street and passerby Pat Getter intervened, nearly putting her life on the line for the ducks, yelling at cars "Stop! Stop! Stop!" Down the street, Jennifer Helburn threw herself in front of a bus to protect the ducklings. Ms. Lopez's comment? "But then came a classic moment in newspaper-reading double takes: Helburn's day job? She is communications director for the National Abortion Federation, a trade association for abortion providers in the U.S. and Canada. The tragic ironies. You'd think human kids might deserve the same right to life ducks deserve.

Don't get me wrong, I'm glad the ducks survived their inside-the-Beltway rush-hour adventure. If only unborn-baby humans could stop traffic somehow."

There are 52 vacancies in the Circuit District Courts and the US Senate Committee on the Judiciary has classified many of these vacancies as "Judicial Emergencies". Vacancies mean court cases are on hold - awaiting a judge to be confirmed so the case may be heard. The Constitution is being side-lined by the actions of a Minority of pro-abortion Senators who will prevent the President's pro-life judicial nominees at any cost. Even at the cost of our founding forefathers vision of the Constitution!

In his June 30 column, syndicated columnist Bob Novak predicted that Chief Justice Rehnquist will announce his retirement, and that President Bush will nominate Sandra Day O'Connor to replace him as Chief Justice. Bush will then nominate his White House Counsel, the "moderate" Republican Alberto Gonzales, to her vacant seat. Novak points out, "That means the Supreme Court will not improve from the standpoint of conservative legal scholars, who view the court as dysfunctional despite a half-century of Republican appointments."

RESEARCH PERSPECTIVES

PRO-LIFE PERSPECTIVE

The Nuremberg code of medical ethics states that human research MUST involve informed consent AND MUST be done to benefit the individual being experimented upon. Neither criteria is met with embryonic stem cell research and human cloning for research purposes. Both are unethical and immoral, being reflective of the Nazi experiments. While no one disputes the value of scientific research for the purpose of finding cures to debilitating and often fatal diseases, who would have thought we would need to protect people from becoming the cure? Extracting stem cells from embryos, whether produced by fertilization or cloning KILLS a tiny human being (remember, life begins at conception). Fortunately, researchers have discovered ethical alternatives. Adult Stem Cell Research has shown more promise than embryonic stem cells and presents no ethical dilemma. Our time, energy and financial resources are better spent there.

MERCK PERSPECTIVE (fetal tissue research)

MERCK: A coalition led by Human Life International and Children of God for Life has successfully steered a resolution to a vote at the Merck & Co. annual stockholders meeting. The resolution stated, in part, that "Merck has violated its basic Statement on Values because of our company's use of cell-culture lines from aborted humans." The resolution received 5 percent of the stockholders' votes, which opens the door for additional action in the future.

Merck has responded by advising their employees that they will no longer provide matching charitable contributions for Human Life International. AMA PERSPECTIVE

The American Medical Association went on record the week of June 16, 2003, in favor of cloning human

EUROPEAN UNION PERSPECTIVE

If granted approval by the European Parliament and a majority of the European Union (EU) member states, EU scientists will receive funding from the union IF they use stored or frozen embryos left over from fertility treatment and created before June 27, 2002. Member states will vote on the proposal after debate in November.

BISHOP'S PERSPECTIVE

In response to the announcement of plans to use eggs from the ovaries of aborted unborn babies for IVF treatment, the Rt. Rev Peter Smith, Archbishop of Cardiff, who chairs the Bishops Conference Committee for Christian Responsibility and Citizenship, told *Independent Catholic News* "During the last 18 months scientists working in this field seem to have completely lost their way. This is like going back to the Nazi experiments performed during the Second World War."

Other reactions to the news: horror, and fear that aborted female babies could become a highly marketable commodity. Fertility experts said these eggs could "ease a global shortage of donated eggs."

BOYCOTT UPDATE:

The following information is taken from the May 2003 edition of *The Boycott List*, which publicizes the Corporate Funding Project of Life Decisions International (LDI):

The following corporations have been added to the *Boycott List*: Church & Dwight (Arm & Hammer, household cleaners, condoms, deodorants, Nair, and more), Gannett (newspapers, Army Times Publishing, Nursing Spectrum, Telematch); HMV (music & videos, books); IBM; National By-products (rendering company, Qual Pet foods); Sara Lee; Four corporations have been removed and two others agreed to stop funding NARAL/CARAL before being added to the list. To date, at least 91 corporations are known to have stopped funding Planned Parenthood, NARAL/CARAL as a result of dedication to the boycott, prayers, and hard work.

On July 3rd, we received notice that:

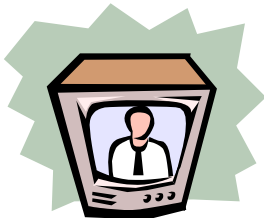
“one-time boycott target Berkshire Hathaway, which owns The Pampered Chef, Dairy Queen, See's Candies, and several other companies, announced that it will no longer allow its shareholders to designate where the corporation's donations will go--effectively cutting off Planned Parenthood. Consequently, Berkshire Hathaway has been dropped as a boycott target (including all of its subsidiaries). LDI will continue to monitor the corporation's philanthropic activities to ensure that it does not resume funding Planned Parenthood or any other pro-abortion entity.”

YOUR PASS**

The Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) has hired Patricia Ireland as the next head of the organization. Ireland is the former leader of the National Organization for Women (NOW), a radical feminist group that is pro-abortion and pro-homosexual. Along with the announcement of their new CEO came the announcement that their national headquarters is moving to Washington, DC. Relocating to Washington from New York, the YWCA, said Ms. Ireland in an *AP* report, "will play a more active role in public policy debates."

Norma McCorvey (the original Jane Roe) sought to have the *Roe v. Wade* edict overturned in court. Federal District Judge David Godbey dismissed the case with the declaration that her filing was not timely. Her attorney, Allan Parker, said his client will likely ask the court to reconsider its ruling because "this is not a case of newly discovered evidence, which must be brought in a short amount of time. It's a case of changed factual conditions and the law."

Operation Outcry/Silent No More – affidavits by some 1,000 women who have been aggrieved by abortion have been filed, attempting to open the court's eyes. **ACTION:** it's not too late to sign on - both men & women over 18 can sign a Friend of the Court petition.
