SOCIAL JUSTICE COMPATIBLE WITH PRO-LIFE CAUSE

Those who feel passionately about social justice and world peace share the same values as those passionately pro-life. The ethic of the common good, if consistent, links the life issues with the justice issues. Denver Archbishop Charles Chaput once wrote that, while he respects (politician's) commitment to peace and justice, he's "always been puzzled by political leaders who exclude unborn children from the protection of the justice they publicly claim to champion." The protection of innocent life is a first principle of justice.

It must be made clear that the life issues are public issues with immense public consequences and not simply matters of individual 'choice.' As Pope John Paul II put it, "If you want peace work for justice, if you want justice, America, defend life." Care for God's creation is basic to the fight against abortion, poverty, war and injustice.

Those working to end abortion and those working to end poverty share the belief that the government has a role in setting public policy that protects the marginalized, provides for those who cannot care for themselves and promotes the common good. Both are willing to sacrifice for the common good. The life and dignity of the human person is basic to a preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. When abortion is ended we will have learned to respect another human being for nothing other than his or her being alive.

Our duty to be compassionate to others begins with those in the womb, the weakest and most vulnerable among us. Ending abortion recognizes and restores human rights in total to every human being, regardless of sex, race, nationality, condition, age, stage of development or arbitrary acceptability. Our duty to be compassionate to others continues with a desire to end poverty, violence, injustice and war. True peace, lasting peace starts with ending violence in the womb; that is, stopping abortion on demand—the 'war on the unborn.' This will influence our thinking and attitude about extra-uterine warfare and violence. The means to that end varies, but the common goal is peace, justice and life for all.

The 109th Congress

- **CHILD INTERSTATE ABORTION NOTIFICATION ACT (CIANA) H.R. 748** Has passed out of the House. The current Senate version, called the **Child Custody Protection Act (S403)** has appeared on the Senate calendar for ‘anytime action’ since February 17th, having bypassed committee. This law will make it a federal offense to transport a child across state lines for an abortion unless parental notification laws in effect in the home state are fulfilled.
- Senator Tom Coburn (R-OK) has proposed a **PARENTS RIGHT TO KNOW ACT OF 2005**. The main provision of the bill would require Title X clinics operated by states and funded by the federal government to notify parents 5 days in advance of providing contraceptive drugs to minor children.
- Reports have surfaced that some hospitals are not following the **BORN ALIVE INFANT PROTECTION ACT**, signed into law in 2002 by President Bush. Mike Leavitt, secretary of Health and Human Services vowed to "investigate all circumstances where individuals and entities are reported to be withholding medical care from an infant born alive in potential violation of federal statutes."
- **A HUMAN CLONING PROHIBITION ACT HAS BEEN RE-INTRODUCED** in both houses of Congress. Senators Sam Brownback (R-KS) and Mary Landrieu (D-LA) filed S-658, which has been referred to the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor & Pensions. HR-1357 was introduced March 17 by Representatives Dave Weldon (R-FL) and Bart Stupak (D-MI) and is pending in the House Committee on Judiciary.

IOWA LEGISLATION

- **Parental Notification:** The Iowa House passed HF 787 in March. The bill asks the Health Department to record the number of judicial waivers granted and the reason for giving permission to waive parental notification. All reporting is done in good faith and no record is kept of who or what facility. The bill does not identify judges or districts. HF 787 now moves to the Senate Human Resources Committee. Iowa Right To Life has determined that the bill is flawed in favor of Planned Parenthood unless legislators add the "court amendment" to the bill. The court amendment addresses *who* reports the number of waivers to the Health Department. Abortion providers have been unreliable in their reporting of statistics. The amendment requires each court to report their own information directly to the Department. Without the amendment, the law provides confidentiality without accountability.
- Representative Eichhorn, of Hamilton County, is responding and taking action after what happened to Terry Schindler-Schiavo by proposing legislation to protect people with disabilities from starvation and dehydration. The bill would create in the law a presumption that an incompetent person would have wanted nutrition and hydration. On the flip side, the proposed bill provides that the presumption is overcome if the patient executed a valid written declaration (such as a living will) specifically rejecting nutrition and hydration in the applicable circumstances. It also allows the presumption to be overcome "[i]f there is clear and convincing evidence that the person, when competent, gave express and informed consent to withdrawing or withholding nutrition or hydration in the applicable circumstances."

"Ethical Guidelines" Proposed for UNETHICAL RESEARCH!

The National Academy of Sciences proposed national ["ethical"] guidelines for human embryonic stem cell research and recommended that research institutions establish oversight committees to enforce them. (AP, 4/27/05) The academy's guidelines suggest that parents must give their consent prior to giving their embryonic babies over for experimentation, they should not be paid for doing this, and they should be informed that research resulting from the death of their child may have commercial potential, but they will not share in any financial benefit.

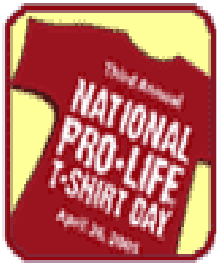
The academy also took on the matter of creating chimeras (creatures made up of combined human and animal cells). According to the *International Herald Tribune* report online (4/28/05), the academy's guidelines would limit two kinds of experiment that incorporate human embryonic stem cells into animals. Undesired consequences might follow if human cells were incorporated into either the sex cells or the brains of the experimental animals. The [National Academy of Sciences](#) was established in 1863 by President Abraham Lincoln. Since then, it has functioned in an independent advisory capacity to Congress and the White House on science, engineering and medicine. Its members elect themselves and each other. Its power is enormous and is exercised through a complex network of like-minded individuals operating in both congressional and legislative committees, federal, state and local agencies, college and university Ph.D candidates and medical and scientific entities, both public and private. **There is no way to have "ethical guidelines" for UNETHICAL RESEARCH!** [excerpted from: RNCL FAX Notes]

Recently in England, a young woman died from Ovarian Hyperstimulation Syndrome (OHSS) after receiving IVF treatment. In another case, a female Stanford college student in California died from OHSS after contributing her eggs to get money for school. If procedures like ESCR become common practice, more women will be viewed as mere stores from which to purchase eggs, exposing them to risks like OHSS. The women in all our lives deserve better.

In April, the Institute of Medicine (IOM) released a report, ***"Cord Blood: Establishing a National Hematopoietic Stem Cell Bank Program."*** The IOM study recommends a national network of cord blood stem cell banks, and they recommend that any cord blood collected that cannot be used for treatment should be made available for research. *"This IOM study will provide additional momentum to the passage of the "Cord Blood Stem Cell Act of 2005" so that the cord blood stem cell network can be authorized by Congress and additional funding can be authorized to scale up this network as soon as possible,"* said Smith. *"But this is so urgent that administrative action needs to be taken while Congress moves the bill through the legislative process."* Congressman Smith is the author of the **"Cord Blood Stem Cell Act of 2005," HR 596.** The bill would create a connected national network of public umbilical cord banks and authorize \$15 million in federal funds during Fiscal Year 2006 and \$30 million in FY '07 to subsidize the collection, processing, testing, freezing and storing of cord blood stem cell units that would then be made available for transplantation treatments.

Good News!

- In March, the Senate rejected the **Reid-Clinton** amendment to the FY 2006 Congressional budget resolution. This amendment would have funded a public education campaign to boost awareness of the morning-after-pill, teen pregnancy prevention programs involving the discussion of sexually explicit material and would also have expanded a birth control program for low-income women and health insurance coverage of contraception.
- Senator Barbara Boxer (D-CA) has been forced to withdraw her amendment to a spending bill that would have forced doctors to perform abortions and that pharmacists should be forced to fill prescriptions for abortion drugs such as the "morning after pill." Senator Boxer could not find sufficient Senators to back her.



Roosevelt High School Threatens Pro-life Student--Take Off Pro-life T-Shirt or No Diploma For Older Sister—Des Moines, IA— There was an incident at Roosevelt High School as two students were not allowed to wear their pro-life t-shirts on National Pro-life T-shirt Day. According to the Thomas More Center, students have a Constitutional right to wear pro-life t-shirts. In Tinker v. Des Moines Independent Community School District, the US Supreme Court clearly stated that public school students do not lose their constitutional right of freedom of speech or expression once they pass through the schoolhouse gates. The Court said in its 1969 decision, "They (students) may not be confined to the expression of those sentiments that are officially approved."

You may have seen an article in the Telegraph Herald—the principal has since apologized for what he cited was an "error in communication."

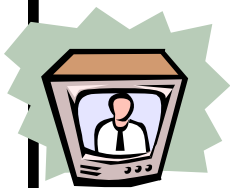

Boycott Update– Corporations

Doug Scott (President, Life Decisions **Corporate Funding Project**) reports that due to intensified research of corporate supporters of Planned Parenthood (PP), a record 19 corporations *may* be added to the next *Boycott List*. Each corporation has been contacted and given the information on PP. They are now waiting for the responses. Please pray that the information will touch their hearts and minds. In addition, 114 local/regional businesses have been identified as PP supporters. I will share the information as soon as we receive it—but be prepared to contact these businesses. It is imperative that they hear from us ASAP after being added to the list so they know we are serious about where our money goes!

Debi Vinnedge (President, *Children of God for Life (COG)*), reports outrage at learning that General Electric will pursue embryonic stem cell research. COG suggest that current stockholders sell and reinvest in companies that are not involved in unethical research. Whether or not you are a shareholder, please contact them at once and voice your complaint. Mark Crutcher (President, **Life Dynamics** [LD] of Denton, TX) has investigated the parent company of LifeChecks, personalized checks which bear a series of pro-life images and messages. Here’s what the report says, “Besides LifeChecks and a series of patriotic and pro-family checks under the name “The Check Gallery,” Custom Direct LLC parents a subsidiary called “Message Products,” which, reports LD, “makes checks for Planned Parenthood, The National Organization for [sic] Women [NOW], The American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU), several gay, lesbian, bi-sexual and transgender rights organizations,” reports LD, “and other radical left-wing groups.” Though LifeChecks was originally developed by a pro-life couple, George and Marlys Johnson, who donated part of the proceeds of their sales to various pro-life ministries, the company which took over LifeChecks in recent years “does not appear to make ... contributions to pro-life groups,” writes LD, “for the sale of LifeChecks. ... Adding insult to injury,” reports LD, “the Message Products website states that some of the revenue generated by the sale of its checks is funneled back into these [left-wing affinity] organizations, with the total contribution being \$500,000 per year.” If you have these checks, they come with a money back guarantee, so you may want to ask for a refund. Be sure to tell them what it is you don’t like! *Life Advocacy Briefing* spoke with Mr. Johnson and learned he is looking into developing a new, reliable line of pro-life bank checks but is not yet ready to announce plans. Boycott Update-Charities

RATIONALE: WE MUST NOT INDIRECTLY SUPPORT ABORTION BY CONTRIBUTING TO ORGANIZATIONS SUPPORTING EMBRYO AND/OR FETAL TISSUE RESEARCH. ANYONE SUPPORTING THIS TYPE OF RESEARCH IS SUPPORTING THE KILLING OF HUMAN BABIES AT VARIOUS STAGES OF GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT. **THE END DOES NOT JUSTIFY THE MEANS.**

We have been working behind the scenes to add to our web site the responses we get from various charities to our questions regarding their use of donations received. We are concerned primarily with their involvement in fetal tissue or embryonic stem cell research and cloning. We also question if they have an official policy/position on abortion. Any additional information about their dispersal of funds is bonus—that is, not solicited from us. Our concern is that we know which organizations are doing and/or funding research involving the killing of human beings. Our research for this project has been going on for several years and our files are full of information about many of your favorite charities. Until we finally get it posted, we encourage you to call us for this information.

Because of our project, an article in *Our Sunday Visitor*, “Beware of ‘good causes’ that also support abortion” (January 9, 2005) caught my attention. They were reporting on the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation’s relationship to Planned Parenthood (in 2003 the foundation gave \$450,000 to the group). They listed several organizations with questionable ties: the American Cancer Society, the American Red Cross, Girl Scouts councils, the YWCA and the March of Dimes. Other organizations that do not have direct links to Planned Parenthood but still support contraception or abortion include UNICEF, Crop Walk and the United Way –in some locations (decisions for where it gives its money are made at the local level).

For those of you wishing to contribute to an organization targeting a specific disease or program, there are alternatives available for most. For example, they list the Breast Cancer Prevention Institute instead of Susan G. Komen; instead of the American Red Cross, your local Catholic Charities also provides emergency relief services; instead of the YWCA and Girl Scouts, the YMCA and Boy Scouts and the American Heritage Girls are good alternatives; and the Michael Fund gives money for birth-defect research. Easter Seals is another “completely clean” organization.

None of this information came as a surprise to us—we have files on each of those mentioned. That’s why this is such a big project to get up online and why we ask you to call us in the mean time. However, the **American Cancer Society’s** (ACS) ‘Relay for Life’, the **Muscular Dystrophy Association’s** ‘Jail and Bail’ and the **National Multiple Sclerosis Society’s** ‘Tour’ are coming up, so we’ll talk about them now.

- Under pressure from pro-life groups across the country, including the Catholic Church, the **American Cancer Society** pulled its support of the stem cell research promotion group, “Patient’s Cure,” in July. However, the action apparently was not an indication of the organization’s beliefs about the destruction of human embryo. Spokesperson Joann Schoellenbach said the American Cancer Society believes that stem cell research “holds great promise.” [MCCL News 10/99] Planned Parenthood letter of 2/17/00 lists ACS as one of the groups who “support research with fetal tissue to fight disease and save lives.” In response to our inquiry (7/9/01) the ACS wrote: “The American Cancer Society understands that scientific research using human embryonic stem cells and fetal tissue holds extraordinary potential in the fight against cancer and other life-threatening diseases afflicting more than 140 million Americans. However, the American Cancer Society believes that any such research should be conducted *only* when and if the Federal government affirms the value of this and develops the necessary oversight and regulation to provide the protections under which it could be pursued.” Alternative: Breast Cancer Prevention Institute
- From Ronald J. Schenkenberger, Director of Research Administration for the **Muscular Dystrophy Association** (MDA): To whom it may concern: MDA’s scientific research program is directed toward the search for cures and effective treatments for the muscular dystrophies and a host of other neuromuscular disorders. The Association’s research advisory committees, composed of the country’s most outstanding neuromuscular scientists and physicians, have strongly recommended that MDA support meritorious research using human tissue at all stages of development. To date, MDA investigators have had encouraging results using adult-derived stem cells, but the Association will support embryonic stem cell research in accordance with established government guidelines governing such research. In this connection, MDA will support stem cell research using cell lines already established by researchers. MDA will not support research involving the direct derivation of human fetal or embryonic tissue. [May 29, 2002] [June 11, 2002] [No response to request for information sent 7/03] Alternatives: the Muscular Dystrophy Family Foundation (no research, provides equipment and support) and the Parent Project Muscular Dystrophy (specific for Duchenne & Becker Muscular Dystrophy)
- The **National Multiple Sclerosis Society’s** position (as responded to the American Life League’s request) is: to hold open the door of hope to people with MS, the NMSS supports the use of fetal tissue in biomedical research under the following conditions: the establishing of a supervisory panel on ethics that would advise the Secretary of Health and Human Services on ethical implications of any biomedical research which has been recommended for funding by the professional per review panels; the establishing of specific criteria that would determine the circumstances under which fetal tissue might be used for therapeutic transplantation purposes and the implementing of strict controls to ensure that the criteria are adhered to. The National Multiple Sclerosis Society supports the executive order which lifted the arbitrary ban on the use of fetal tissue. We believe that this could contribute someday to ending the terrible suffering caused by this most common of adult neurological diseases.
