**FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S DESK**



**“WHAT DO YOU DO ALL DAY?”**

You pull up in our parking lot and notice our sign reads something new. You come in and the bumper stickers are stocked and organized. The a/c is humming pleasantly in the background and the office area is tidy and dust free. There is toilet paper in the bathroom when you use it. You notice a nice stack of mail stamped, addressed, and ready to go out the door. You ask a question. Within a few moments, Colleen or I hand you a packet of information, provide you with a phone number to call and give you three talking points on your subject of choice as well as an invitation to our next event or fundraiser. You leave with the pleasant sense of a professionally run office with courteous and knowledgeable staff. At least we hope that is your impression.

In order to present that kind of an image to you, there are dozens and dozens of tasks that need to take place. Someone has to research the information for the sign, confirm its accuracy, and post it—then answer questions almost daily on its messages. The nice stack of newsletters you see requires brainstorming, researching, writing, reviewing, editing, printing, sorting, sticking, and sending. Someone has to pay the a/c bill. Someone has to buy, stock, and replace the T.P., as well as clean the bathrooms. And we must be ready to answer questions or provide literature on every topic from crisis pregnancy centers to living wills to up-to-the-minute legislative activities to fetal development to embryonic stem cell research to cloning. I was recently asked what I do all day. Let me try to expand on the picture I've begun to paint above. There is really no such thing as a 'typical day' at DCRTL. Colleen & I work hand-in-hand on most everything. I read the local newspaper every morning before work. Rare is the day that there isn't a life issue addressed and most days there is *at least one* article that compels me to write a letter to the editor in response. Knowing that so many won't get printed, we only follow through on the most critical issues (or when best inspired).

We usually start our day by checking our email to update ourselves on the latest pro-life information. As an educational organization, it's imperative that we know what's going on and understand the implications. Rarely do we get through that before the phone starts ringing and/or visitors stop by. "What about xxxxx, are they on the boycott list?" "Have you heard of xxxxx, I was told they only do ethical research?" "Your sign says xxxx. Can you tell me more? How can you say that?" We share what we know, make copies of written answers and generally help them understand, then encourage them to share what they've learned. When there is big news (most recently, the Supreme Court decision to uphold the Partial Birth Abortion ban) the numbers of callers increases to match.

Sometimes we stop to pray for a change of heart when we hear of someone planning an abortion and then do our best to effect that change. We have compiled a packet of information on fetal development, the procedure, the effects of abortion and more. The packets are readily available for such a time. We offer to talk with them or to help others know what to say. Or we might share information on post abortion support.

The next caller might be requesting a speaker, so we discuss who we have to speak on the chosen topic for the particular age group and make the contact. Sometimes the speaker is one of us, so much of our day is spent preparing for the speech. Or, we might just assist the others—suggesting particular brochures or visual aids, etc. Sometimes we make contacts to invite ourselves to speak to other groups. We accept every opportunity to have the pro-life message presented—so if we don't have a volunteer, we work it out between us. Meanwhile, I'm working on the newsletter and Colleen is doing membership letters or bills or other office work. In addition, we organize all of our annual events. We make the contacts and all the arrangements (with the help of our faithful volunteers) for our local Walk For Life, the bus trip to D.C. for the National March for Life, the prayer service for the Day of the Unborn, Speaker Training, the LIFE Dinner, Mothers' Day Roses, the LIFE Chain, Pro-Life Awareness Week (speaker, schedules, lifesavers, luncheon, bike ride, etc.), the National Night of Prayer, prayer at the mills and our regular monthly meetings just to name a few.

I haven't mentioned the 'things in the making/projects under construction' - like the fashion show or the maternity home or the special events for targeted groups (Sister's Social, business AM, Open House, etc.) that we do. Then there are the promotions, the advertising, the interviews, the networking, the recording and record keeping we do for all activities/events.


There you have it: a 'typical day' at DCRTL. Thank God for all of our volunteers! I think I'll take tomorrow off. . . . .

## LEGISLATION TO WATCH:

- Sen. Ted Kennedy is the sponsor for S. J. Res. 10 which proposes a federal constitutional amendment that is now referred to by some as the "**Women's Equality Amendment**," but which has long been known as the "Equal Rights Amendment" (**ERA**). S. J. Res. 10 would add to the Constitution the following amendment: "Equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of sex. The Congress shall have the power to enforce, by appropriate legislation, the provisions of this article." This is the same language as in the ERA Congress proposed in 1972 and it would require taxpayer funding of abortions –the reasoning: since only women undergo abortions, the denial of taxpayer funding is “sex discrimination.”
- Pro-abortion members of Congress are seriously advocating the use of your tax dollars to subsidize government-funded abortions! Congresswoman Barbara Lee (D-CA), in concert with a coalition of pro-abortion groups, is proposing to **repeal the Hyde Amendment**, a legislative provision that has restricted Federal funding of abortions for the past 30 years.
- Senators Elizabeth Dole, R-North Carolina, and Ben Nelson, D-Nebraska, introduced the **Elizabeth Cady Stanton Pregnant and Parenting Student Services Act of 2007** (H.R. 1088) today to help pregnant and parenting college students continue their education. The bipartisan Senate bill, if passed into law, would establish a pilot program to provide up to \$50 million in grants to encourage institutions of higher education to establish and operate a pregnant and parenting student services office. The on-campus office would serve parenting students, prospective student parents who are pregnant or imminently anticipating an adoption, and students who are placing or have placed a child for adoption. Legislation with the same name was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Representatives Marcy Kaptur, D-Ohio, and Sue Myrick, R-North Carolina, in February. (**Latest Major Action:** 2/15/2007 Referred to House Committee on Education and Labor. )
- The **Freedom of Choice Act** has been introduced (4/19/07) in both the House (Representative Jerrold Nadler D-NY) & the Senate (Senator Barbara Boxer, D-CA). The bill would “bar government, at any level, from interfering with a woman’s fundamental right to choose to bear a child or to terminate her pregnancy.” It would codify Roe v. Wade into the law and would overturn any pro-life laws state legislatures have enacted.
- The **Genetic Information Nondiscrimination Act** (S. 358). The measure would prevent health insurance companies and employers from discriminating against people who test "positive" for a genetic disease. It is intended to protect the disabled. The concern is that it excludes the unborn. The hope is to close this loophole before passage of the bill.
- The **Child Interstate Abortion Notification Act** (HR 1063) remains in committee on judiciary. It would prohibit taking minors across State lines in circumvention of laws requiring the involvement of parents in abortion decisions.

## ACTION NEEDED:

The **Meehan Amendment** to HR2093 is a provision in a lobbying reform bill (S.1) that would limit the ability of groups (such as ours) to keep citizens informed about what is happening in Congress about topics of interest to us. A similar provision was successfully removed from the Senate version of the bill. The vote is expected to take place very soon. **CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION** boycott: Both the **Muscular Dystrophy Association** (MDA) (Memorial Day weekend) & **American Cancer Association** (ACS) (first weekend in June) have fundraisers coming soon. Here are their respective policies:

The MDA states “to date, MDA investigators have had encouraging results using adult-derived stem cells but the Association *will support embryonic stem cell research* in accordance with established government guidelines governing such research.” An ethical alternative is the **Muscular Dystrophy Family Foundation** 2330 North Meridian Street, Indianapolis, Indiana 46208-5730, Phone: (317) 923-6333; (800) 544-1213, FAX: (317) 923-6334, E-mail: mdff@prodigy.net, http://www.mdff.org. The ACS’s response to our inquiry stated that they understand “that scientific research using human embryonic stem cells and fetal tissue holds extraordinary potential in the fight against cancer and other life-threatening diseases afflicting more than 140 million Americans. *However, the American Cancer Society believes that any such research should be conducted only when and if the Federal government affirms the value of this and develops the necessary oversight and regulation to provide the protections under which it could be pursued.*” In the past, they have joined (others) to *lobby for federal taxpayer funding of stem cell research that requires the killing of human embryos*. Ethical alternatives for cancer research include:

**Amnesty International** (AI). For the past 2 years AI has been considering adding abortion to the list of what they consider “human rights.” They recently adopted a new policy calling for abortions to be allowed worldwide when a woman is a victim of rape or her health is threatened by the pregnancy. They plan to call on all nations with laws that prohibit abortion to change them and make abortions legal. AI wasn’t supposed to make a decision on abortion until after its international meeting this fall. According to Widney Brown, senior policy and campaigns director, the executive board voted to adopt a pro-abortion position in spite of complaints from pro-life members. She denied that the decision was made in secret, stating, “There’s simply no reason for us to ‘publicize’ policy issues.” This is not the first time the group has supported abortion. Six years ago they joined other groups lobbying the UN to include legal abortion in their declaration on women’s rights (Reuters). In their promotional material they describe themselves as “a worldwide movement of people who campaign for internationally recognized human rights.” Their website— [www.amnesty.org](http://www.amnesty.org) —states that the organization works toward “a world in which every person enjoys all of the human rights enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other international human rights standards.” The United Nation’s declaration states, “Everyone has the right to life, liberty and security of person.” Fr.
